- ◆ To begin a Capital Campaign by the end of 2016 to build a new medical facility downtown on our new property.
- ◆ To reach 15,000 patient visits since 2006.
- ◆ To launch a comprehensive Hepatitis C Program in May 2016- the only program of its type in the entire Ohio Valley!
- ◆ To provide more than \$300,000 in free medications to our patients in 2016.
- ◆ To expand our satellite site and serve more people in Mt. Pleasant, Ohio.
- ◆ To welcome new patients from Brooke and Hancock Counties in West Virginia, and Harrison County in Ohio.
- ◆ To expand dental services and behavioral health services.

ence in people’s lives on a daily basis – that’s what matters. It brings me much joy!”



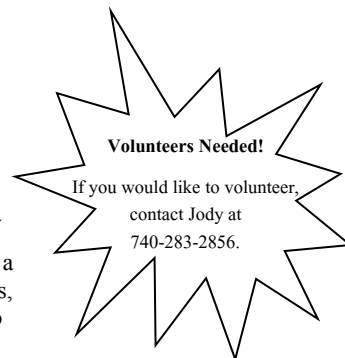
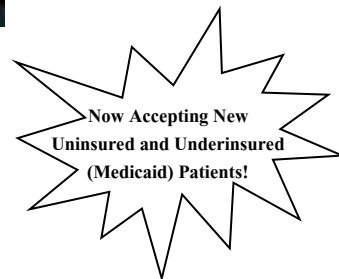

Comprehensive Hepatitis C Program

HCV is spread through contact with blood of someone who is infected. If any of the following points apply to you, you may be at risk for Hepatitis C and should be screened.

- Received a blood transfusion or organ transplant before 1992
- Received blood products for clotting disorder (hemophilia) before 1987
- Shared needles or syringes during IV drug use
- Used nasal cocaine
- Tattoo or piercing performed with a used / contaminated needle

- Healthcare professional exposed to blood or accidental needle stick
- Long-term dialysis treatment
- HIV Positive
- Babies born to HCV– infected mother
- Unprotected sexual contact with an infected person– very rare

At OVHC, Hepatitis C screening is FREE. We provide a comprehensive program from beginning to end for qualified patients. This includes free screening, labs, and treatment.

Coming Soon: Expanded Behavioral Health Services and Expanded Dental Services

Ohio Valley Health Center (OVHC) is now collaborating with Eastern Gateway Community College (EGCC) and Coleman Behavior Services in an effort to expand the range of services and care for our patients.

The collaboration with EGCC will provide our patients with access to regular and emergency dental care, which is a huge need in the Ohio Valley.

The collaboration with Coleman Behavior Services allows a counselor to be on site once a week for our patients who need to talk with a counselor. This can include a range of different issues, including addiction, grief, depression, etc.

With the expansion of behavioral health services, a Certified Nurse Practitioner CNP will be on site to counsel,

prescribe, and manage psychotropic medications for our patients who need them.

With the expansion of these two services, OVHC will be able to provide a more extensive range of whole-person care for our patients.
